
- through Evening Study Centres with special focus on 21st century skills through the periodic capacity building trainings for the staff to achieve the aim.

Celebrations and outings were educative moments to understand cultural roots and strengthen bonds of unity.





ASSIST's role in women empowerment is promotion of equal participation of women and men in decision-making, improve education and health status of women, enhance women's access to resources. Trainings programs and interventions were implemented to facilitate both genders to participate in the gender development interventions and initiatives with the aim of bringing balance in the gender relations and power equations. Gender development is a strategy adopted by ASSIST to empower the women more and ultimately to re-distribute power among women and men.

ASSIST had released a resource kit consisting of books which are compilation on psychology of women, Social Taboos and Successful lives of courageous women, videos, Street theatre scripts and posters to mitigate gender based violence.

ASSIST offers vocational training, Income Generation Programs and Livelihood training as means to ensure economic development which will in turn enable women to participate in household decision making. Inspired by an underlying ethic of compassion for their vulnerability and extreme marginalization ASSIST undertook the mission of providing psychosocial care during Pandemic to mitigate the stress caused by the impacts of lockdown.





In the present knowledge based economy, ASSISTutilizes every opportunity to engage with young population which is the greatest assets for a nation and is regarded as potential and actual investment for a country's development. Releasing the protagonist in the demographic dividend has been the driving focus of every intervention to build the young human resource. Addressing the wide disparity between urban youths and rural youths as to education, income, consumption, access to health care services, political participation leading to many political, socioeconomic problems like high rate of school dropouts, unemployment, early age addiction to

alcohol, tobacco consumption are the few to mention as revealed by the statistics and surveys are the priorities of ASSIST.

ASSIST is engaged in Skill development training, self-employment program and community development program to strengthen the resilience of youth. The following strategies were adapted to enhance the contribution of youth:

- ASSIST in partnership with Quest alliance hasbeen providing platform for skilling and enhancing career building competency for rural and urban underprivileged youth.
- Placement services are provided for the students who complete the course. In


- collaboration with the union office and private companies we identify job opportunities and keep the unplaced students informed about the trainings and openings available.
- Exposure visit to work spots & Guest Lectures enable the students to understand the market trend and the work place realities.
- Alumni Meet as a forum for exchanging ideas on academic, cultural and social issues aids in the tracking of their growth in career and facilitates their collaboration as our extended hands to reach out to the needy in the context.

- Orientation programs and personality development sessions were conducted for college students to enhance their capacities to shape their abilities to achieve their dreams as responsible citizens.
- Human rights education and gender education to instil in them the social consciousness and responsibility towards others.









HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

STEM

Kids were trained in dealing with Electrical and Electronics in daily life and with scratch coding sessions which enabled the kids to utilize Cretile's Explorer kit which acts and sensed like a human. The main aim of the program was to offer them a chance to know the possibilities to become Engineers in future.



Media and Documentation

On considering the importance of media and documentation kids were provided skills development training to prevent direct and indirect risks posed by the media. The main objective of the session was to train the children to become skilful in media and documentation. Kids were trained to understand the advantages of the media and the skills needed for documenting their activities and trainings. Kids learned to write short stories, poems and essays, they also prepared pamphlets to create visibility for the impacts created through the activities of children's parliament.



Gramasaba Participation

GramaSabha meeting is held every year to educate the children regarding the rights and how to obtain the basic rights through Grama Sabha. This year meeting was conducted on 2nd Oct where the evening class students participated with enthusiasm, they confidently said that they have the right to participate in the meeting and fight for their right. Students from 6 Districts participated in their area meeting and sustained their needs by submitting a petition.



Explore and Expose

The main objective of the event was to provide Voracious Awareness to the public dealing with gender based violence and to provide a platform for the students to express their skills; whereas the complications faced during Film Production, especially, short films' script making for street plays were discussed and the participants were given ample time to produce a sample on each topic.



Book Release

Have we ever analyzed whether our words and our clear explanation about something to others are apt or not or have we ever tried to cross check the source of information; and, silence would be the only answer. Hence we tried to bring out the answers based on the discussions about the concept related to women in the society and would like to register it.

"Who defines the concept about the women in the society, whether it is true and whom do they support".

What would be the effect of the scientific world on these concepts. Nobody would have

discussed or even thought about these concepts but it plays a major role on the violence against women. We have compiled these two concepts based on the discussions. It is mandatory to carry out the discussions to ensure a society which is equal to everyone whereas even a ceremony was launched on Anti Sexual Violence documentary collection which was conducted on 8th November, 2019.

International Women's Day was celebrated in ASSIST on March 8th.The emphasis of the celebrations of respect, appreciation for Women's economic, political and social achievements and empowerment. The theme for the day's celebration "Lets Honour Women" focused on mobilizing momentum for the recently adopted 2030 Agenda which addresses key challenges of the 21st century, such as poverty, inequality, and climate change.

SUCCESS STORY

Children

The members of the NCP were enlightened on the impacts of government exams for 5th standard and 8th standard students and they were guided to formulate a request to Chief Minister to stop the government exams for the same group of students. Children engaged in a local advocacy through signature campaign to gain the support of the parents, Self Help Group members and youth group. Later children participated in the Grama Sabha held in their respective panchayats and got a resolution passed to stop the exams. It was amoment of great joy and achievement when the

announcement came about the cancellation of the exams.

Women

SUDAROLI TAILORING GROUP

"ASSIST - Skill Development Scheme" initiated a group named "Sudaroli Tailoring Group" in 2018 with 20 women from Ambethkar Nagar. This area is mostly occupied by the migrants from different places. These 20 women from the Sudaroli group collected clothes from in and around their area and started to stitch. Unfortunately, the lockdown put an end to their income. When they came to know that TNRTP helps such groups by providing loam to help them during this Pandemic situation, they approached them and applied for the "Subsidy Loan." When the officials from TNRTP visited them; they understood their condition and sanctioned a loan of worth Rs. 1, 50,000 with subsidy, which helped the ladies to continue their work without any struggle. This was a great sigh of relief for them.

Youth

Malarselvi is a role model to all who carries the family's financial burden. As a D.ted graduate, she hadbeen working as a nurse in DRT clinic for 6 years. She was married to Mr. Nagaraj who has been working as an Accountant. Both of them were earning to support their family. They have been working happily but not so long.

She lost her satisfaction where she was working. She felt stressful and was losing her hope. She was trying her best to overcome the situation, but time made her to relieve from the job. She had a tough time for 5 months without job. She had been trying to get a job but she couldn't. Meanwhile she came to know about the Skill to succeed program. Immediately she joined the course and improved her skills all over the course period.

Now she has been working in billing department of Medical shop. Now her job satisfaction has been restored. She enjoys the job that she does. She is very thankful to ASSIST and its Skill to Succeed program.

COVID 19 RELIEF WORK

Pandemic has introduced us into a new normalcy which is an advantage for a few in the society and a cause for concern to the society at large. Our target group consisting of the rural and urban poor who are daily wage labourers, lepers, gypsies, beggars and other vulnerable people have experienced the pain of the pandemic. We have been associated with these communities for the past 18 years. We have seen a gradual growth and transformation in their mentality, lifestyle and competencies. Now during this turbulent time we felt the need to upport them and encourage them to live with hope. It was an opportunity to strengthen our

network with the local leaders, Police and Government Officials to make our reach valuable one.

ASSIST the Social Development Office of the Province along with the community of Divyadhanam and the Provincial House have succeeded in mobilizing funds and providing food supplies to families of our Evening study



centre students, Self-Employment Group members and those in need. We had supplied PPE to Medical persons, masks, sanitizers etc to common public. Awareness about the preventive measures was given through distribution of leaflets, posters, games and videos.
